

WHAT TO EXPECT AS THE WATER LEVEL RISES

12.5 METRES – *(At this point, the road starts to flood at the end of the island)*

- When water levels reach 12.5 metres we will give residents an early advisory on the potential for flooding.
- We will be continually monitoring levels and will keep residents updated hourly via social media and local radio.
- We will urge everyone to begin preparations, in the event of flooding.

13.0 METRE

- Our local emergency operations centre will be open and we will be actively monitoring and assessing the emergency as it evolves.
- Health and social services will begin to reach out to their long term care patients as well as the elderly under their care, to begin preparations for potential evacuation of these residents off the island.
- We will further urge the community to continue to prepare and be ready in the event we do issue an evacuation order.

13.5 METRE

- **The emergency operations centre will begin the evacuation of the elderly and long term care residents off-island**

14.0 METRE

- The Village will sound the siren for 2 minutes.
- The emergency operations centre will advise all local business and schools to close in preparation for an evacuation.
- School buses will move children back home to parents and caregivers.
- We will set up an evacuation registration point for residents at the recreation centre.
- Those who wish to leave and require transportation should begin to gather at the recreation centre to begin the registration process.
- Those who are moving with relatives or friends on the hill, are asked to also register at the recreation centre.
- We will be updating every fifteen minutes on social media and local radio.

15 METRES – EVACUATION LEVEL

- The siren will be activated a second time.
 - Emergency operation support staff will be canvassing door to door to assist anyone needing transportation to the recreation centre.
 - Those who can should leave for shelter on the hill, with family or friends, or proceed directly to the airport.
 - Those without transportation will be bussed to the airport for evacuation.
- *Rcmp and other support staff will continue to monitor the community.*

If the NTPC Power Plant is forced to shut down, then a generator will be set up on the hill to supply power to all residents off-island.
